

- Transportation alternatives should be affordable because it improves the environment and overall quality of life.



# MY SCHOOL IN MOTION



GVF began a new partnership with the Norristown Area School District and Lower Merion School District to offer the My School in Motion Program. The program will be offered at schools in the Norristown Area School District and Lower Merion Area School District during the 2024-25 and 2025-26 school years. The program is funded by a Transportation Alternatives Set Aside Grant and introduces students to the benefits of walking and biking, the basics of pedestrian and bicycle traffic safety, multi-modal transportation planning/engineering, and civic involvement.

GVF kicked off the program with an event at Eisenhower Science and Leadership Technology Academy. Over 120 students walked and biked from ESTLA to the nearby Elmwood Park, where they participated in activities learning about safe walking and biking behaviors.

PA State Senator Amanda Cappelletti, NASD Superintendent Christopher Dormer, and the Norristown Police came to support the event and the partnership between NASD and GVF.

# Helmet Distributions

GVF partnered with the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services to distribute helmets to students at Blockson Middle School and Eisenhower Science and Technology Leadership Academy. In total, over 150 helmets were fitted and distributed to students and families in the Norristown Area School District.



# Biking and Walking Audits



## Eisenhower Science and Technology Leadership Academy

Representatives from GVF, the Municipality of Norristown, Montgomery County Planning Commission, State Representative Greg Scott's office, and Norristown Area School District observed student dismissal, with a focus on major intersections and improvements that could be made to the infrastructure to improve safety.

## Blockson Middle School

Students from Blockson Middle School, led by a teacher, met with GVF and shared their experiences with walking and biking to school. The group reviewed the perimeter of the school, noting popular walking and biking routes, and areas that would benefit from additional supervision or infrastructure changes to enhance safety.



# King of Prussia Central Park and Ride Study

GVF continued a two-year partnership with Upper Merion Township and PECO to study the King of Prussia Central Park and Ride and formulate recommendations to increase connectivity. The project is funded by a Travel Options Program (TOP) Grant and administered by DVRPC.

The Park and Ride is located near US 202, I-76, and the Pennsylvania Turnpike and has access to the Chester Valley Trail and Schuylkill River Trail. It is currently serving as an intercity bus stop for Greyhound, Flix Bus, and Fullington Trailways. GVF's study aims to provide recommendations to improve the experience for the variety of people using the Park and Ride to access TDM options available at the location, including intercity bus riders, trail users, and people utilizing carpools and vanpools.

The Upper Merion Economic & Community Development Committee hosted a Week of Service that included a clean-up of the King of Prussia Park and Ride. GVF and other community partners participated in picking up trash in the lot, surrounding area, and along the Chester Valley Trail.



# Streets for All Grant One-Year Follow-Up



GVF partnered with the Borough of Phoenixville and North Coventry Township to implement the Streets for All Program during the 2022-2024 grant cycle. This partnership addressed Chester County's recommendations for its Active Transportation Inventory (ATI) plan and adopted the County's Complete Streets Policy. The projects were funded by a Travel Options Program (TOP) Grant from DVRPC.

In the Summer of 2025, GVF reached out to both the Borough of Phoenixville and North Coventry Township to discuss the status of the projects funded by the TOP Grant, and to discuss current and future walkability initiatives in each municipality.

Through collaboration with Borough staff, the project delivered a heavily used mid-block crosswalk on the 100 block of Bridge Street, connecting Phoenix Village Apartments to nearby destinations and sparking a renewed borough-wide emphasis on walkability. Building on lessons learned, the Borough is pursuing additional funding to relocate and enhance the crosswalk with curb extensions, rain gardens, and flashing pedestrian lights, along with similar safety improvements at other locations. Phoenixville is also updating its walkability map to highlight sidewalks, trails, parks, and short walking distances to encourage residents and visitors to park once and walk to local destinations.

Demonstration Crosswalk at West Main Street and South Hanover Street

In North Coventry Township, the demonstration crosswalk at West Main Street and South Hanover Street was made permanent, strengthening a key pedestrian connection between Riverside Park East and West. Since the grant concluded in Summer 2024, the Township has continued investing in pedestrian safety by replacing 20 ADA ramps, installing a new mid-block crosswalk, improving roadways near York Street Park, securing over \$287,000 in PennDOT ARLE funding to upgrade traffic signals with pedestrian enhancements, and pursuing funding for playground and sidewalk improvements, while continuing to work with developers to create safer, more walkable spaces township-wide.





In 2025, GVF's Advocacy Committee worked to advocate for SEPTA Funding, as SEPTA faced a steep budget deficit entering the 2026 fiscal year. To address this deficit, SEPTA planned service cuts and fare hikes beginning in August 2025. GVF tirelessly worked to advocate for full SEPTA funding and ensured that GVF partners were aware of the impact that the planned cuts would have on municipalities, businesses, traffic, and tourism in Southeastern Pennsylvania.

GVF Executive Director, Rob Henry, joined elected officials and business leaders, including GVF Board Members Montgomery County Commissioner Jamila Winder and King of Prussia Mall General Manager Bob Hart at a press event to raise awareness for the need for funding held at the King of Prussia Mall Transit Center.




## MLK Jr. Day Drive
